Overall review of evaluation results

(Joint International Master's Programme in Sustainable Development (Hiroshima University - University of Graz))

The program was established in October 2020 under the theme of Sustainability Studies, after formulating the three policies aimed at developing human resources with an ability to conduct research and practical work based on international cooperation principles in development studies and using social scientific approaches, and those with a high level of communication skills to collaborate with people with diverse backgrounds. Since the establishment, faculty members from Hiroshima University and the University of Graz have collaborated to provide research guidance through a common curriculum, offering distinctive educational content of both universities such as public policy to alleviate poverty in developing countries, economic analysis, social science analysis, and sustainable management of companies.

This Self-inspection and Annual Report covers the six months immediately after the program's establishment (from October 2020 to March 2021); 16 criteria were judged to be "fully applicable," three criteria were judged to be "applicable," and six criteria were judged not subject to evaluation.

In the future, we will steadily implement the approved curriculum and continue to identify issues and consider improvement measures based on the needs of students, etc. in cooperation with the University of Graz.

The curriculum is systematically organized to foster students with an ability to conduct research and practical work based on international cooperation principles in development studies and using social scientific approaches in order to resolve pressing regional and global issues related to the SDGs, and those with excellent collaboration and communication skills to be exerted at universities, research institutions, governments, international organizations, private businesses, NGOs, etc., as well as competitive capability to secure employment in the international labor market. Furthermore, these class subjects are taught by faculty members with high expertise who have been screened for educational qualifications at the Graduate School, and thus educational content of a level appropriate for the degree to be awarded has been ensured.
