Graduation Thesis (elective) in the fourth year, with a particular topic the student finds from various economics related questions designed to allow students to acquire communication skills, the command of giving a presentation and problem finding and solving abilities, as well as other related skills developed while they are collecting the necessary literature and materials to prepare their thesis.

N Method & time of assignment

Graduation thesis in the fourth year requires students to attend Seminar (required) in the third year. Which seminar will be assigned in the third year will be decided after students apply for seminars in the second semester of the year. As a general rule, only students who have been enrolled in this university for at least two years, and who obtained at least 36 credits, including the following conditions, are eligible to attend seminars.

- í at least 7 credits in foreign language subjects
