



Reconstruction and Peacebuilding



Reconstruction and Peacebuilding is not confined to developing countries in Africa, but it also concerns the present pandemonium in Iraq, Afghanistan, the post-Arab Spring Mediterranean seaside areas, Ukraine conflicts, and highly volatile Korean Peninsula. Conflicts and large scale natural disasters can totally devastate the countries and regions whose disaster response capacity is severely limited due to the weak governance and lack of basic social infrastructure. Consequently, major damage is inflicted on the regions' socially vulnerable people. Effects of such major catastrophes are becoming even broader and more immense in today's fast globalizing world. This is clear from the refugee crisis that has become a divisive issue in the EU who was once the epitome of success in the post WWII international order. Building and maintaining more peaceful nation and society not only require appropriate urgent response to any disaster. We also need longstanding approach so that we do not reiterate tragedies. However, this is not an easy task especially today when economic growth began to falter worldwide and many countries are facing serious deficit of human and other resources. In this symposium, we will have a candid discussion on the prospect of peacebuilding in the world of 21st century where the US, China and Russia engage in a competitive confrontation.




